Welcome to another bumper edition of our regular round-up of all that's been taking place at Oldham's amazing Music Centre in the last few months. As you will see below, despite the arrival of Spring, the grass has most certainly not been allowed to grow beneath our feet, and our fantastic Music Centre members and teachers have been busy with a multitude of musical projects.

Many of you will have been to one or more of the wonderful Departmental Concerts that took place in March. During the course of the week hundreds of Oldham's finest

musicians participated in performances given by our choirs, wind and brass bands, orchestras and various other groups from across the musical spectrum. The Music Centre's adult and community groups were also a key part of the week having their own concert on the Friday evening. Throughout all this diversity, one common thread was really apparent and that was that the standards being achieved by these musicians are exceptional and that the impact caused by the pandemic has well and truly been shaken off.

March also saw the return of the Music Service's annual 'Biggest Band Day'. For this event we invite hundreds of beginner instrumentalists to spend a day out of school in an intensive day of music-making with their instrumental teachers. The day then culminates in a concert to parents and carers in the Queen Elizabeth Hall. Taking part this year were 144 brass and percussion students, 98 woodwind students, 62 guitar students and 24 string players who were supported and directed by 14 Music Service teachers. As you can imagine, this is one huge band and it's fair to say that their final performance really brought the house down!

Other highlights not included elsewhere in this newsletter included the Pop Department's 'Easter EGGstravaganza', which once again was held in Dobcross Band Club and the performance given to the Oldham Education Leadership Conference by our advanced Electric Guitar Group, 'EGG 3'.

I am sure that you will agree with me when I say that we are extremely proud of our musicians and teachers here at the Music Centre and continue to be delighted by the sensational standards that they achieve. Thank you for your continued support of these amazing opportunities and I look forward to seeing you at future concerts and performances.

OMC Youth Brass Band Cheltenham

On 23rd March, the Oldham Music Centre Youth Brass Band travelled to Cheltenham to take part in the National Youth Brass Band Championships. They were competing in the highest category, largely against county and large city bands. They gave a superb performance of their programme, entitled "Space" receiving excellent reports from the adjudicator and being awarded silver. The adjudicators said that the band gave, 'a superbly crafted programme…your presentation was the best we had all day'.

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Not content with a flying visit to Cheltenham, the band stayed over at Cheltenham Ladies College and on the Sunday morning they performed, open-air, in the sunshine, at Sudeley Castle for the first weekend of the opening season and also for Lady Ashcombe's birthday. That afternoon they presented a concert at St. Peter's Parish Church in Winchcombe, to a very appreciative audience. The concert was also broadcast on local radio.

We arrived back in Oldham late on Sunday evening, tired but pleased with a very successful weekend's work.

The workshops included: Bucket Drumming, Musical Vocabulary Explained, Muslim Songs for KS2, Music Technology (Chrome Music Lab), Ukulele Basics and Vocal Warm-ups.

Some of our Music Centre students attended the National Youth Concert Band course over the Easter Holiday. An intensive week of music making, the students worked with specialist tutors over the course of the week at Stamford School in Lincolnshire, building up to the end of course concert at Warwick School. This year the repertoire included Grant Kirkhope's trombone concerto 'Kirkfeld', in which the band were joined by the BBC

Symphony Orchestra's principal trombone player Helen Vollam.

During the week the group also had a workshop Issie Barratt, Artistic Director of the National Youth Jazz Collective, as well as opportunities to take part in chamber ensembles and rehearse solo pieces with the course accompanist. NYCB are holding a short summer residency at Chetham's School of Music in Manchester, where friends and family are warmly invited to join them for a concert in the Stoller Hall at 2:30pm on Sunday 25th August.
